Partner spotlight - New Castle County Community Services

Introduction to the Department of Community Services

The New Castle County Department of Community Services provides a wide range of services to New Castle County residents and visitors that build communities, improve neighborhoods, and ensure safe places and spaces for people of all ages and abilities to live, learn, socialize, and play. Divisions include Community Development and Housing, Community Resources, and Libraries.



Hope Center Overview

The New Castle County Hope Center provides temporary, emergency non-congregate shelter for Delaware residents experiencing homelessness. The Hope Center houses individuals and families in a converted hotel purchased by New Castle County in 2020. The County oversees shelter operations, and a partner company manages hotel operations. The Hope The Center provides wrap-around services, including medical care, healthcare, addiction services, and case management, to investigate other social services, workforce opportunities, and opportunities for permanent housing.

The Hope Center houses approximately 400 individuals, including 100-150 children at any given time, aiming to find permanent housing within 30 to 90 days. Currently, a United Way program provides onsite activities and organizes events and field trips for families, but no academic enrichment program exists for K-12 students. This RFP seeks to find an experienced partner to engage youths at the shelter and provide individual after-school tutoring to advance their academic potential. The Hope Center Academic Enrichment Program is intended to focus on academics and supplement the services provided by the United Way. The County will oversee the program's effectiveness by speaking with students, families, and teachers and reviewing individual student progress reports.



Partner spotlight - New Castle County Community Services

Annual Socks Drive

Sock collection boxes are placed across New Castle County at libraries, recreation centers, and county offices. The 20 convenient locations make it simple for New Castle County residents to make sock donations. In partnership with New Castle County, Charity Crossing has collected 8,000 pairs of socks to help the community stay warm.

Socks are the #1 most requested clothing item in homeless shelters. - Bombas

Glasgow Park Partnership

The Glasgow Park "Red" Bank Barn in the farm complex is home to Charity Crossing's giveaway events. The partnership between Charity Crossing and New Castle County began in the summer of 2022, growing from one to two events per month. These events serve families, individuals, veterans, first responders, and healthcare professionals in need. Donations to the public include household items, school supplies, and other personal items. At least 400 to 500 people benefit every month.



Each people attending the event receive at least \$25 worth of donations. By the end of 2022, at least 5,000 community members would have received \$125,000 worth of donations.

November, a record month for Charity Crossing

In a month of giving, filled with joy, thankfulness, and love, Charity Crossing volunteers served 5,000 different people across four states. We gave out roughly \$125,000 worth of donations and prevented at least six truckloads of goods from being tossed into landfills.

Despite the cold and windy November weather, on November 19th and 20th, Charity Crossing served 1,771 community members among 14 locations across DE, NJ, PA, and MD. With each person receiving at least \$25 worth of goods, our organization distributed more than \$44,275 items to our communities. The previous weekend, November 12th and 13th, we distributed items in 13 different locations to 1,137 community members of all ages. That's another \$28,425 worth of donations.

But weekly serves weren't the only thing Charity Crossing was involved with in November. Our leads arranged their charity events along with our countless warehouse volunteers and members who sorted boxes at home. With the help of other leads, MOT Charter High School sophomore Sai Suram led a sock/clothing drive in over 10 locations across DE. Along with the clothing raised from the collection locations, companies pitched in to help too. Apparel company Bombas, who pledges to donate a pair of socks for every pair bought, donated 9,000 socks to our drive.

n a single month, Charity Crossing and our amazing volunteers, partners, and donors made incredible contributions to our communities. Although we set some remarkable records this month, we look forward to breaking these next month and in the new year. Thank you to each of our phenomenal volunteers, partners, and donors for their part in making November truly a month of giving! Happy holidays!.

A quick reference guide to our Volunteers

Here is some information that you need to know:

- Register at https://charitycrossing.org/register/ (one-time activity)
- Sign up for events at https://charitycrossing.org/events/ (you need to do this every time you want to serve). You can view the events you registered for at https://charitycrossing.org/registered-events/ It is hard to find volunteers at short notice. Please avoid last-minute cancellations.
- Record your service hours at https://charitycrossing.org/vtf/
- You are welcome to bring your family to serve. However, you must buy volunteer tickets for them when registering for an event. All volunteers' tickets are free.
- A parent or guardian must accompany all minor volunteers.

- Service hours are calculated as follows: actual service hours plus travel hours (travel hours should not exceed 1 hour).
- You may be eligible for Presidential Volunteer Service Awards. Check eligibility criteria here https://presidentialserviceawards.gov/eligibility

Matching Donations


As Charity Crossing is a non-profit organization, a big part of the reason we can constantly serve the community is due to help from corporate donors. An amazing example of this occurred in February, when JP Morgan Chase, Bank of America, and other employers matched employee donations and helped raise \$11,713 for Charity Crossing's vehicle fundraiser. We encourage you to check with your employer to see if similar programs are available!

Dollars-for-Doers / Volunteers Grant Program

Dollars-for-Doers is a corporate program that distributes monetary grants to non-profit organizations where its employees volunteer. They are also known as volunteer grants or dollarsfor-hours programs. The process of receiving one of these grants is essentially the same. First, the employee must volunteer with a nonprofit. They then request a grant from their employer, who will verify the number of hours performed, then send a check to the non-profit organization. Some companies offering dollars-for-doers or volunteer grants include Bank of America, TD Bank, Aetna, Microsoft, and many more. Please check with your employer.

Organizing a birthday fundraiser using social media is a great way to raise funds for Charity Crossing.
