It takes 8 to 9 months to produce a baby Jasmine plant. Caring for baby Jasmine plants inside the home during winter is the toughest. With Almighty's blessing, we are able to produce more than 20 Jasmine plants every year, which we sell to raise funds.

An email from a Foster Parent (To protect privacy of this family, names have been changed):

"Yesterday I was informed that I was the chosen CASA to award one of my kids a Nintendo Switch. Being a CASA for 14 years has been one of the most rewarding things in my life. I can make a difference in a child's life, and I am excited to provide this to a deserving young lady. Because I have 5 teens in my care, deciding who was most excellent was tough.



Angel is going to be 14 in a few months. She has had the most traumatic and horrific life of any child in my care. She is so grateful for anything given to her because she has so little. We gave her socks and underwear, and she cried. She is a very intelligent, unselfish, and pretty young lady who deserves to have some good happen in her life. Her mother is a drug addict. Her addiction caused great harm to all of her 8 children. In a week, she will deliver number 9th. All of them were addicted at birth and taken into custody. Before Angel came into (my) care, she did all the caregiving to her younger siblings. She watched her mom get high and have men in and out of the home daily. She saw and experienced things no child should ever have to endure. She is with a relative who loves her but cannot provide much for Angel because she lacks finances. Seeing what this poor girl must go through daily breaks my heart. She wants to be like her friends. She can't talk about her great life, the places she has visited, the movies she has seen, the vacations, trips to the mall, and just enjoying being a kid. If I could give her one thing to make her happy, my job would be all worthwhile. I can bring joy to a wonderful young lady who really deserves it. Thank you for letting me share this with you, and hope she is chosen. There will be tears of joy, I can tell you that."

My personal experience

Growing up in India, I saw similar things daily. Such incidents registered deeply in my subconscious mind, acting as a daily guardrail for me. On the other hand, my children & others of the same age don't have such opportunities to understand the life challenges of fellow citizens. That's one of the reasons I created Charity Crossing, so our children can get that awareness. I appreciate all those parents who volunteer along with their children. You have given opportunities for your children to learn valuable life lessons. That's only 0.01% of the parents.

Gloves Initiative

A couple of weeks ago, the CC Delaware warehouse received a large number of vinyl glove boxes in our donations. We received over 200 boxes and each box held ten smaller boxes with 100 gloves each. Overall, we totaled over 100,000 pairs of gloves that we needed to find some use for. So, CC youth leaders got to work and started the "Gloves Initiative." They created a group chat on WhatsApp and asked the CC community for volunteers who wanted to help distribute gloves to the nearby community and small businesses. They created a spreadsheet to keep track of how many boxes were being promised to different places/people to make sure they were not promising to deliver more boxes than they had available. They also enforced a rule that said no organization could receive more than 10 boxes (10,000 gloves total) unless they could provide a reason for needing a larger amount. Through this, the "Gloves Initiative" was able to provide thousands of pairs of gloves to members of the community, small businesses, local hospitals, and more.

Oh Boy! For a short while, we didn't know what to do with that.

That afternoon, we messaged our contacts. One of them responded "Yes". Today evening all these food products are being delivered to a deserving young man, who is on tube feeding. The young man is in his 20s with special needs. Our heart is filled with happiness knowing that we were able to play a small role in this young man's life.

What is tube feeding?

Tube feeding is a therapy where a feeding tube supplies nutrients to people who cannot get enough nutrition through eating. A flexible tube is inserted through the nose or belly area to provide nutrients by delivering liquid nutrition directly into the stomach or small intestine.

Doctors usually insert the tube while you are in the hospital, but you may continue to use it outside the hospital, at home, or in a nursing facility. Tube feeding is also known as enteral nutrition and if provided at home, is termed home enteral nutrition (HEN).

Charity Crossing uses POINT App to publish Volunteer events and track volunteer service hours. It is a One-Stop shop. Registering, signing up for events, and tracking your service hours are convenient.

Helpful Tips:

- Download the app at pointapp.org, the App Store, or Google Play.
 - From the desktop, go to: http://app.pointapp.org/
- Create a new account using your home EMAIL ID
- Enter all the necessary information. You must enter your Full name, email id, phone, and city. DOB will help when ordering medals and certificates. The address is optional but suggested to enter.
- Follow causes that you care about. Aka-what do you want to get involved in? Think: ending homelessness, tackling climate change, helping animals, etc.
- Choose Charity Crossing as your Organization to view CC events.
- Sign up for events. Find a CC event and sign up by tapping "GO."

Amazon Smile

Matching Donations

As Charity Crossing is a non-profit organization, a big part of the reason we can constantly serve the community is due to help from corporate donors. An amazing example of this occurred in February, when JP Morgan Chase, Bank of America, and other employers matched employee donations and helped raise \$11,713 for Charity Crossing's vehicle fundraiser. Dollars-for-Doers / Volunteers Grant Program

Dollars-for-Doers is a corporate program that distributes monetary grants to non-profit organizations where its employees volunteer. They are also known as volunteer grants or dollars-for-hours programs. The process of receiving one of these grants is essentially the same. First, the employee must volunteer with a nonprofit. They then request a grant from their employer, who will verify the number of hours performed, then send a check to the non-profit organization. Some companies offering dollars-for-doers or volunteer grants include Bank of America, TD Bank, Aetna, Microsoft, and many more. Please check with your employer.
